

Jeremiah 26 and 27 Jeremiah's Conflicts

- Conflict with Judah 26:1-24
 - Jeremiah speaks to the people v. 1-6
 - Priests and Prophets want his life v. 7-9
 - Jeremiah defends his role v. 10-15
 - The officials turn the crowd from evil v. 16-19
 - Jeremiah at riskC Jehoiakim had killed once before v. 20-23
 - A godly servant of Josiah also serves Jeremiah v. 24
- Conflict with the False Prophets 27:1-22
 - Jeremiah is told to wear the yoke and bonds v.1-2
 - God's message: to the nations; submit to Nebuchadnezzar my servant v. 3-11
 - Edom, Moab, Ammon, Tyre, Sidon & Judah
 - Jeremiah goes to Zedekiah personally v. 12-15
 - Jeremiah goes to the priests; telling them to not listen to false prophets v. 16-22
- Prophecies
 - Verse 7, God establishes the leadership of Babylon for the seventy years of captivity
 - Verse 7, God establishes that Babylon will also have a time of destruction like Judah
 - Verse 7, God establishes that the Chaldeans will then serve many nations and kings
 - Verse 22, God would visit all the vessels of the house of the Lord and bring them back for His personal worship
